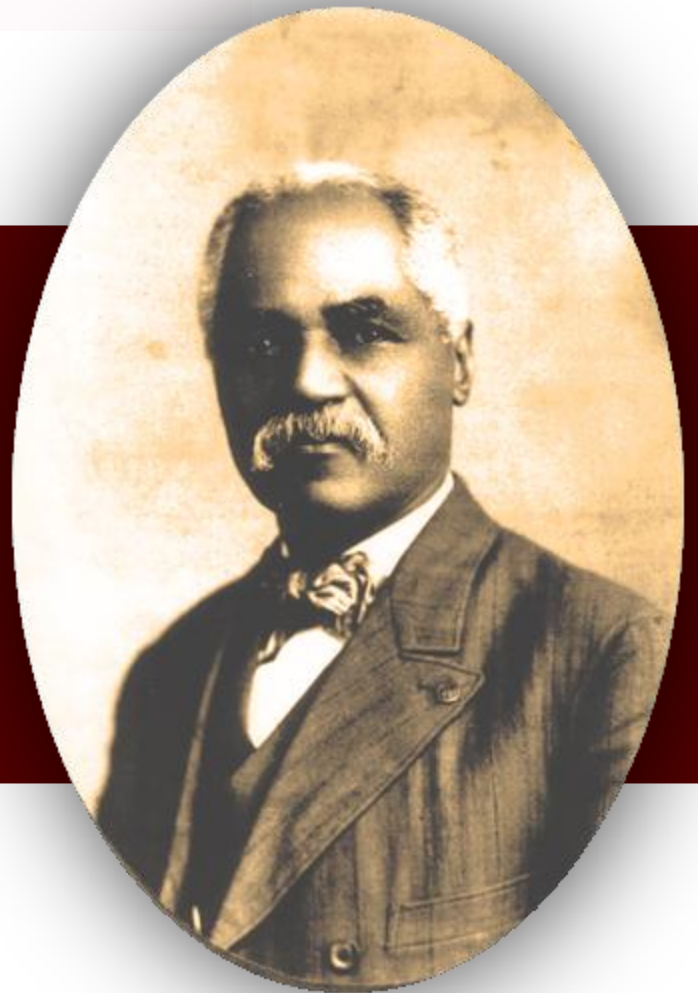

Title: JR Clifford Unit Plan for 1st grade

Grade Level/Subject: 1st Grade - Social Studies

WV Content Standards(s) and Objectives:

- **SS.O.1.1.4:**
demonstrate respect and responsibility for self and others' materials and belongings.
- **SS.O.1.1.5:**
be given the opportunity to recite the Pledge of Allegiance, participate in patriotic singing and celebrate national holidays and discuss their significance.

- **SS.O.1.5.3:**

Day 1: Introduction Activity- Primary Sources, Coloring/Reading/History Book

- **Essential Questions:**

- Who was JR Clifford?
- What did JR Clifford do?
- Where is JR Clifford from?

- **Materials Needed:**

- JR Clifford story/coloring book
- Crayons
- Pencil

- **Instructional Procedures:**

- Teacher will ask students if they have ever heard of JR Clifford.
- Teacher will read the story about JR Clifford as it is told in the Coloring book
 - students will follow along as the teacher reads.
- Students will color, neatly, the first two pages of the book.
- Teacher will monitor the room and ask students questions as he/she moves about the room, make sure students are on task, and assist students as needed.

- **Assessment:**

- Teacher will ask students, at random, questions from the story.
 - Who was JR Clifford?
 - Where was he from?
 - What did he do?

Day 2: JR Clifford Song- read over together, sing together

- **Essential Questions:**

- What did JR Clifford do?
- What was his court case about?
- How did his court case help us today?

- **Materials Needed:**

- JR Clifford Song
- Projector
- Coloring book
- Crayons

- **Instructional Procedures:**

- Teacher will review what students learned from the story about JR Clifford yesterday.
- Teacher will inform the class that he/she is going to teach a song about JR Clifford.
- Teacher will sing the song one time for the the class, then sing a line and have students sing it back. Teacher and students will then put it all together.
 - The words will also be put on an overhead projector so students can follow along.
- Students will then work on two more pages of the coloring book.
- Teacher will monitor the room and ask students questions as he/she moves about the room, make sure students are on task, and assist students as needed.

- **Assessment:**

- Teacher will ask:
 - What did JR Clifford do?
 - What was his court case about?
 - How did his court case help us today?

Day 3: Treasure Chest- compile a list together of what it's in the chest, what it is, etc.

- **Essential Questions:**

- Who can tell me about one item in the box?
- Why do you think the item was in the box?
- Are any of the items still in use today?

- **Materials Needed:**

- Treasure Chest - with items inside that JR Clifford might have used, or might have been useful during that period of time.
- Coloring book
- crayons
- JR Clifford Song
- Projector

- **Instructional Procedures:**

- Teacher and Students will sing the JR Clifford song.
- Teacher will show the class the "treasure chest" and ask "what do you think is in the box?" - while the lid is still on it.
- Students will make guesses of what might be in the box.
- Teacher will explain that the items in the box are items that JR Clifford might have used OR items that were around during his time.
- Teacher will pull an item out of box (one at a time) and ask students what they think it is and what it is used for.
- Students will guess what the object is. If students do not guess what the object is, and what it is used for, teacher will tell the class.
 - the process will continue until every items has been talked about.
- Students will complete two more pages in the coloring book.
- Teacher will monitor the room and ask students questions as he/she moves about the room, make sure students are on task, and assist students as needed.

- **Assessment:**

- Teacher will pull items out at random and ask students, at random, what the item is and what it is used for.
- Teacher will then ask:
 - Who can tell me about one item in the box?
 - Why do you think the item was in the box?

- Are any of the items still in use today?

Day 4: Vocabulary Lesson- basic key terms from coloring book- Bingo

- **Essential Questions:**

- How do the vocabulary words related to JR Clifford, or his life?
- Where have you seen these words before?

- **Materials Needed:**

- Bingo Card
- Coloring book
- Vocabulary words
- Pencil
- Crayons

- **Instructional Procedures:**

- Teacher and students will sing the JR Clifford song together from memory
- Teacher will introduce vocabulary words from the story.
 - born
 - town
 - read
 - home
 - pride
 - colors
 - help
 - subjects
 - court
- Students will receive a bingo sheet and be instructed to put a word in each different box.
- Teacher will monitor the room and ask students questions as he/she moves about the room, make sure students are on task, and assist students as needed.
- Students will play BINGO

- **Assessment:**

- Teacher will read the story of JR Clifford to the class again, but students are responsible for underlining vocabulary words as they go through the story.
- Teacher will monitor the room as she reads, while students are underlining the words.

- Teacher will ask:
 - How do the vocabulary words related to JR Clifford, or his life?
 - Where have you seen these words before?

Bingo chart (blank - students put their words where they choose)

Day 5: Baseball Card- draw a picture, birthday

- **Essential Questions:**

- Where was JR Clifford from?
- What did JR Clifford do for a living?
- When was he born?
- Who was JR Clifford?

- **Materials Needed:**

- Paper
- Sample Baseball card
- crayons
- Coloring Book
- JR Clifford song

- **Instructional Procedures:**

- Students will sing the JR Clifford song for the teacher (*part of assessment - copied in that area*)
- Teacher will introduce his/her baseball card and explain to students they will be making their own JR Clifford Baseball card.
- Teacher will inform students that the following need to be on their card:
 - Picture of JR Clifford on the front
 - His name on the back
 - Birthday
 - Where he was born
 - What he did for a living
 - Where he was from
- Teacher will monitor the room and ask students questions as he/she moves about the room, make sure students are on task, and assist students as needed.
- Students who finish early will continue in their JR Clifford Coloring book.

- **Assessment:**

- Teacher will ask students at random to present their baseball cards.
- Students will sing the JR Clifford song for the teacher
